## Finding the Full Gospel

Building God's Kingdom on Earth



This article is premised on the idea that most churches are NOT teaching the full gospel as taught by Jesus. In doing so, they are withholding necessary information its people desperately need to survive, live and thrive. This is not only cheating the people but it's blasphemy to God by withholding the truth as in The Full Gospel!

Yet how many of our churches are 'lukewarm' and seem to have no real passion, no sustainable energy outside of the musical spectacles they put on to energize the people with entertainment? How many are really 'on fire' with the holy spirit: healing, casting out demons, tending to the needs of their flock?

Do the people go to the services out of desire and passion to be close to God, HIS spirit and be with other 'on fire' believers? Or do they seem to go more out of a sense of 'duty' and to participate in the same ritualistic routine for the 'appearance' of holiness much like the Pharisees wanted to be seen 'doing the right thing' in the eyes of others?

Back to the question: "Is my church teaching the FULL gospel as taught by Jesus?" Let's put it to the test with a few key guestions.

We could start with these questions;

- 1. When was the last time anybody from my church with a disease or ailment was healed by the power of the Holy Spirit with the help of anyone from my church? Is my church tending to the physical needs of its flock?
- 2. What is my church doing to feed the people in the local area who are hungry and in desperate need of love, attention and hope? How many of these opportunities are being passed by to bring people to Jesus?
- 3. How many extra bedrooms exist in the homes of the congregation and how many of those are being used to help the homeless get back on their feet and get their life back together again? How many of these opportunities are being wasted?
- 4. How many people in the congregation have submitted themselves to another master as debt slaves to maintain their lifestyle and love of this world? Does the pastor even talk about this?
- 5. How many times has the pastor talked the truth about the reality of hell and the real consequences of being apart from JESUS for eternity? Or does he stay 'away' from unpleasant subjects and prefers to tickle peoples' ears?
- 6. Has the pastor made it entirely clear in everyones' mind that we are saved by grace through faith and that faith without works is dead? In other words, our daily lives reflect the works which prove our faith which leads us to salvation. And have we instituted a system of accountability or support among our brethren for this purpose? Or do we learn that 'once saved always saved' and we can live any way we like if we just believe?
- 7. How many of the flock in the congregation receive some form of government financial assistance because they can't count on their church community to help them in times of need?
- 8. How many pastors live in plush homes and drive fancy cars while others in the 'church' are suffering? Does he even know who's suffering? How many in the flock turn to dead

corporations and government for work instead of turning to the church community for trade and self support? Does the church even promote this idea?

Only you have the answers for your church. But let us add some more answers to what you already have.

- 1. This is extremely rare. Why? A) Because the church is not filled with the Holy Spirit and the pastor is not teaching properly. B) Because this could be considered political activity and against the narrative of Big Pharma and the local medical associations who wish to maintaining a monopoly on health care. All tax exempt corporate churches are subject to this government control and risk losing their tax exemption so the churches stay away from these teachings and have sold out to Baal.
- 2. If they are doing anything in this area, is it only on special holidays like Thanksgiving or is it year around 7 days a week and is a matter of continual service to the needy? Evaluate this and ask questions and see what you come up with.
- 3. Probably few to none because of a long list of excuses which are presented as 'risk factors' or 'inconveniences' all of which could be easily managed if the desire were truly there. Where is the commitment to serve each others needs with love and in so doing to serve
- 4. Most everyone lives in debt in the Babylonian system in order to maintain their lifestyle and in so doing they get trapped into servitude through fraud and corruption in the financial system which uses false weights and measures. This can be eliminated and solved with the proper approach. We can help.
- 5. Probably very little if ever. Today's pastors prefer to talk in ways which tickle the peoples' ears to keep them coming back and financially supporting the church. The reality of hell is unpleasant and would scare some people away. The reality is we all need to be 'scared straight' to make sacrifices to keep on the proper path to heaven and not to hell.
- 6. Talking about 'works' again brings up duty and responsibility when most people just prefer to have their ears tickled with the 'Prosperity Gospel' and 'Name it and Claim It' as they choose the path to temporal prosperity rather than the path to heaven and eternal peace and prosperity.
- 7. When we have to turn to public institutions for help when we need it, rather than systems created by, for and in our own communities, we invite adultery of the faith by engaging in contracts for benefits with foreign powers which are contrary to our interests and beliefs.
- 8. Again, entangling ourselves with the world instead of our own communities is a trap to take us away from a 'God Centered Life'. It ultimately dilutes our faith, our strength and power in ways we never even recognize in most cases.
